ABOUT BIG SCRUB RAINFOREST DAY 2016

The Big Scrub Rainforest Day is Australia's largest annual environmental and community event and this year we celebrate 30 years of rainforest restoration at Rocky Creek Dam.

The 2016 event is presented by the Big Scrub Landcare Group in association with Rous County Council, EnviTE and Rainforest Trust Australia. The event is organised with the assistance of local and regional community organisations and individuals. It has wide support from Landcare groups, local government, local business and state government agencies.

The day is special because of the participation of the Widjabul people of the Bundjalung Nation, leading ecologists, rainforest regenerators, naturalists, scientists and other professionals who share their expertise and volunteer their time in presentations, workshops and walks. The day also provides fun activities for the whole family, food, entertainment and a wide range of displays and stalls by community groups and other organisations.

WHAT IS THE BIG SCRUB?

Once the largest expanse of subtropical rainforest in Australia, the Big Scrub covered a roughly circular area where presently Lismore, Ballina, Byron Bay and Mullumbimby are situated. Of the original 75,000 hectares, now less than 1 percent - only 300 ha, of scattered rainforest fragments remain.

The remnant areas contain a rich diversity of flora and fauna, supporting more than 300 species of trees and shrubs. At least 28 threatened species of flora and 22 species of fauna occur in these remnants. Their high conservation value is reflected in their status as critically endangered nationally.

ROUS COUNTY COUNCIL – WATER FROM THE BIG SCRUB

Rous County Council is the regional water supply authority providing water to approximately 100,000 people in the local authority areas of Lismore, Ballina, Byron and Richmond Valley. All of the key existing and proposed water sources of Rous County Council (Rocky Creek Dam, Emigrant Creek Dam, and the Wilsons River Source) are located within the Big Scrub landscape.

In this way, Rous County Council represents 'water from the Big Scrub rainforest'. Rainforest regeneration in the Big Scrub landscape serves a range of functions that improve the quality of the catchment, and have a beneficial effect on water quality, one of the key management goals of Rous County Council. Big Scrub restoration is considered critical for the conservation and enhancement of biodiversity in the Big Scrub landscape, and important for our water future.

MESSAGE FROM ENVITE

EnviTE Environment is a not-for-profit organisation working in partnership with the community to restore our natural environment. We work with public and private land managers, Indigenous communities, Landcare, local councils, government agencies and developers. Our services include bush regeneration, ecological restoration planning, seed collection, propagation, revegetation, landscaping, flora, fauna and habitat surveys and habitat restoration. We deliver environmental training in conservation and land management skills to community groups, Green Army participants and others.

EnviTE has implemented environmental grants exceeding \$12 million and other ecological restoration contracts valued at over \$15 million. In the 2015 – 2016 financial year, 31 environmental grants and 170 fee-for-service projects were underway. EnviTE has partnered with Big Scrub Landcare to restore lowland rainforest for over 20 years.

MESSAGE FROM RAINFOREST TRUST AUSTRALIA

Rainforest Trust-Australia saves real acres of rainforest by purchasing and protecting significant parcels of land - both here and abroad. We also give communities hands-on opportunities to protect and enhance these special places. Each project we work on has been identified as crucial to preserving critical habitat for endangered species.

In the Big Scrub Rainforest we're supporting local restoration efforts by working with Madhima Gulgan to provide Indigenous people with training and employment opportunities. To help visit rainforesttrust.org.
